



Young Adult in Global Mission

You all, without a doubt, know the story. Depending on your Gospel of choice, you may know a different version than your fellow church goers. But you know the gist. The Savior of the world is born in a grungy place. Everyone seems to agree that Jesus was born in a very small town called Bethlehem. In the picture to the left, you can see the widely-perceived birthplace of Jesus Christ.

It's a hole. A well-decorated one, but a hole nonetheless. Believe me, I've seen it. It lies in the grotto beneath the Church of the Nativity in the center of Bethlehem, Palestine.

To be living and volunteering in a place so close to this very church is, quite frankly, surreal. I've grown up hearing about the hills upon which Bethlehem stands. The shepherds' field. The intermingling evergreen and palm trees. It always seemed like such a mystical place.



Now, I'm living here for a year. That may not seem like a lot of time, but it's already been long enough to make connections and experience the commonalities of day-to-day life. It's been long enough to condition me to be just a little annoyed at the site of overly long lines of people waiting to get a chance to see places like this. There's a bit of a "Christian Disney Land" feel to it all, as someone I know so eloquently put it. But the local people are the reason I am here. The Palestinian Christians that I have the absolute pleasure to interact with each day

make the whole experience a gift. And, regardless of the lines, it is a privilege to see this Holy place.

So then, what is it like to be in Bethlehem on Christmas Eve? Well, I must say that I have never seen so many people celebrating a Christian holiday in one place. The lines at the Holy sites were longer. Nativity square, in the center of town, was packed for most of the day. It was impossible to walk through the space without stepping sideways and bumping into people after the sun went down. The great tree that had assumed the focal point of the square was surrounded by Palestinian and foreign visitors alike. But the real excitement of the day came from the parade in the morning. Hundreds of scouts from area churches and religious organizations gathered in bands and drumlines and marched throughout the city. They were clad in colorful outfits to represent their churches and hometowns. There was a band of drummers and bagpipers dressed in capes decorated with the Jerusalem cross.

To cap off the day of festivities, a group of my friends and I attended a 10:00 p.m. prayer service at the Christmas Church. We sang, prayed, and listened to a heartfelt sermon together before returning home for the night.

Just so you can see how heavily visited Bethlehem is, here are some of languages I heard on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day: Arabic, English, Hebrew, German, Spanish, French, Hindi, Xhosa, Mandarin.

They had an excellent trip and learned and saw a lot. The youth will be traveling to Kansas City, Mo. July 14th- 20th, 2019. There are six kids signed up to go--3 from Hope, 2 from St. John, and 1 from St. Paul. Pastor plans to attend a meeting with the Candidacy Committee of NE IA Synod February 1 and 2, 2019 in Cedar Falls.

Committee Reports: (Parish Education) EWALU has new forms for the camperships and financial assistance is available. Motion by Joyce for the family to pay the first \$100.00 for the EWALU camperships, seconded by Bonnie, motion carried. (Worship) The 2019 ushers and readers sheet is being completed. (Evangelism) Dennis will be the council representative for the Evangelism Committee. (Building and Grounds) A garbage disposal was installed in the parsonage. (Social Concerns) A soup and sandwich lunch will be held January 13, 2019 after worship. A free will offering will be collected for EWALU camperships. Another soup and sandwich lunch will be planned for February 10, 2019. Council members will have a short meeting, Sunday, February 3, 2019 after worship to discuss the February 10, 2019 soup and sandwich lunch.

Old Business: There was no old business.

New Business: The 2019 Lenten Schedule was reviewed. The youth will be having soup suppers on March 13 and April 3, 2019. The Lasagna Meal and Auction will be Sunday, April 7, 2019. Motion by Larry to keep the same council member officers and committees, seconded by Doug, motion carried.

The next regular meeting will be Tuesday, February 12, 2019 at 7:00 pm.

President Richard called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Pastor Margaret led the group in a devotional prayer. Minutes of the previous meeting and treasurer’s reports were read and approved. Income for the month was \$4,444, and expenses were \$4,280. Central State Bank was thanked for sponsoring the holiday event in Dec.

Pastor Margaret presented her written report. Parish choir practice will be held twice a month. She reported on her and Pastor Mark’s trip to Palestine and Israel. There will be a slide presentation Feb. 24 at St. Paul.

New Business: An election was held for president and vice-president. Richard Thurn was elected as president, and John Hunt as vice-president. Council installation will be Jan. 27.

Hope will pay our share of parish office Internet and phone expenses for the month.

Some changes were made to the proposed budget to cover an increase in insurance cost and Parish expenses. The insurance premium is now due. A motion was made, seconded and carried to pay the entire bill at one time.

The biennial report to the Secretary of State has been completed and sent.

The date for Hope's annual auction was set for March 17 at noon. The WELCA will be serving a lasagna meal following worship and prior to the auction. Anyone who has items to auction may contact a council member, so they can be advertised.

The men of the church will host a Valentine meal Feb. 10 following worship. Everyone is invited.

There was discussion on improving parking lot conditions by the south door of the fellowship room. Work will be done in the spring.

The next meeting will be Thurs., Feb. 7 at 6:00 at Pastor Margaret's home.






