"As a deer longs for flowing streams,

So my soul longs for you, O God.

My soul thirsts for God,

For the living God." Psalm 42:1-2

Have you been thirsty lately? I sure have been. When I go out and spend even just a bit of energy in the summer heat we've had lately, I long for a tall, cool glass of water. Brothers and Sisters in Christ, I need, we all need, to gather together as church. We need to be together to praise God in song. Hearing of one another's joys and sorrows, holding one another up in prayer and hearing the word read and preached. That is something our souls long for. There are days we may not think we need to gather in worship but those are very likely days our brothers and sisters need US to be there – to confess their faith for them, to hold them in prayer, to sing songs of lament and praise for and with them. Our core being needs that nourishment to function well as people of faith, followers of the Living God!

Maybe you just need to be there to hear that your sins are forgiven, that God loves you and to hear a blessing pronounced. When I am part of the body of Christ in worship, feeling the love of God through my neighbors around me, when I hear "the body of Christ given for you and the blood of Christ shed for you," when I hear voices joined in praise and blessing, voices joined in singing and in prayer, it's like the heavens have opened and the rains have begun to bring me to life and wholeness again.

St. John Lutheran Council

The regular meeting of the St. John Lutheran Church Council was held Tuesday, June 8, 2021, at 6:30 pm. Present: Marcia Rueber, Doug Nus, Jeri Watson, Penny Handke, Kelli Knickerbocker, Joyce Knickerbocker, Cassie Gruman, Pastor Margaret, and Deatra ODell.

President Marcia Rueber called the meeting to order. Pastor Margaret led devotions based upon Psalms 100. The secretary's report was reviewed and approved, moved by Jeri, seconded by Joyce, motion carried. The treasurer's report was given with an income of \$4,218.01 and expenses being \$10,797.93 (one time insurance payment, air conditioner, and tree removal in addition to our regular expenses). In June we will only need to pay one half of our parish commitment. Penny moved to approve the treasurer's report, seconded by Jeri, motion carried. The QSS account has a balance of \$1,281.74.

Pastor Margaret gave highlights of her report. Pastor Clark and Pastor Margaret are discussing how to best cover worship several Sundays. Pastor Margaret will be absent. We will begin using the blue *With One Voice* hymnal Sunday, June 20. "Office hours" are continuing at Embers and Treats. VBS in Arlington may be held in August. Six youth from our Parish are attending a Youthworks servant trip July 18-24. They have sufficient funds, but may hold one or two more fundraisers.

Committee Reports:

Parish Education: EWALU is hosting 800 plus campers this summer.

Worship: In July worship time will switch from 10:30 to 8:30 with a coffee fellowship following. Marcia will host the first fellowship and have a sign-up sheet ready for further Sundays. July 11 will be the Arlington Days Community Worship Service in the Upper City Park.

Building and Grounds: The tree is down and all cleaned up. Doug sprayed around the church and along the west ditch. Someone ran into/over the

handicapped sign in front of the church. The old sign and post will be replaced. The sale of the corner lot at Liberty and Park Avenue is being finalized. Our parsonage renter is leaving July 1 and will return July 5 to have it cleaned and inspected so that their deposit can be returned. Our church offering practice will change so that it begins at the back of the church progressing toward the front.

Stewardship: Clothes will now be collected and sent to the Mission. Cassie, Charlie, and Maria Gruman will attend the Synod Assembly and provide a report.

Parish Board: The Parish Board is discussing the possibility of a new Parish Photo Directory.

Unfinished Business: June 13 will be our Special Dedication Sunday of the memorial gifts of the baptismal bowl, white paraments, and the gold communion chalice. We will have communion and Audrey Bazyn, daughter of Emily and Tyler Bazyn, will be baptized.

New Business: Recognition of Pastor Clark's Retirement will be held Sunday, August 29, at St. John's with a potluck and a special dessert. The Women of the Church will serve beverages.

DB Acoustics met with some church council members earlier in the month to provide us quotes for video display options for the church sanctuary and a quote to make our carillon system functional again. In light of the interest and funding in the memorial account, the board decided to accept the proposal for the carillon system. Motion by Joyce, seconded by Doug, motion carried. In studying the video display options, Jeri made the motion proposing the installation of two TV displays and improved sound system at an approximate cost of \$18,000.00 to enhance our worship service. A special congregational meeting will be held at which questions may be voiced and additional information will be provided. Kelli seconded. The motion carried.

Our next meeting will be held Tuesday, July 13, 2021, at 7:00 PM. Doug moved to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Kelli, motion carried. The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.

The Parish will be celebrating Pastor Clark's retirement on August 29 at 10:30 am, at St. John with a potluck following. No other churches will have services that day. The parish board and Pastor Margaret are discussing options available to the parish once Pastor Clark retires.

Each church is only required to pay half their monthly commitment in June and a reminder that July 1st, St. Sebald switches services times to 10:30 am for a year. The council also briefly discussed Germanfest and cleaning up the items on the perimeter of the basement. Tracy requested the use of the basement on July 11th to celebrate Owen's baptism with family. The next council meeting is July 8th at 7 pm, at St. Sebald. Wayne moved to adjourn the meeting, 2nd by Jerry, meeting adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.

The sale of the lot beside the church is still pending, but in progress. Will update when we have it finalized.

New Business: New clocks were purchased and Denny Christeleit will be installing them in the church.

The general checking fund is very low. Council has decided to write a letter to the members about this dire circumstance. We've also discussed possible events/fundraisers we can hold to raise money for the church to help. We will be trying to set up a drive-through lunch/dinner sometime soon.

Pat Klingman moved to adjourn the meeting, Denny Christeleit seconded. The next meeting will be held July 14th, 2021 at 6:30 pm.




