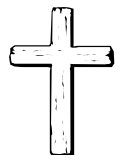

Is There a Cure for Loneliness?

“Is There a Cure for Loneliness?” That’s the title of an article I read in a recent issue of my AARP magazine (that’s right, I’m a proud AARP member!). Lynn Darling, author of the article says, “We know that Americans are at risk for social isolation, which can lead to physical illness, depression and even dementia.” The article goes on to explain that we all have a human need to be embedded, connected, integrated in social networks and when those social networks are missing, “the consequences are very real in terms of mental and physical health.”

Research has shown that the intensely personal experience of rejection, disconnection and longing that are part of what is defined as “loneliness” produces actual pain as real as can be caused by a physical injury. Of course, the article, being published in the AARP magazine spoke most especially about this phenomenon in older adults, but you and I know this can be an issue for people at any age. People who are lonely can develop a distorted reality about the social world around them and that can lead them to actually withdraw more from others, leading to a vicious cycle which can cause more loneliness and greater isolation.

So what’s a lonely person to do? Well, again research has shown that cognitive behavior therapy can help someone who’s lonely to better understand how to connect in meaningful ways with others. Other research has shown that taking Tylenol or Aleve, common anti-inflammatory drugs can help ease the very real pain of loneliness.

So is there a real and true cure for loneliness? In my personal experience, I would say, yes!

When my husband, Mark and I first came to Hong Kong where we were to live and teach English in a Chinese middle school for three years, the first people we met in the airport later became part of our cure for loneliness. They were part of the church in Hong Kong that would become our extended family, our dear friends. We would

eat together, worship together, pray together, laugh and cry together. We didn’t agree politically all the time with all these brothers and sisters but we still had the most important thing in common – our faith! I feel these same sense of community and belonging when I worship with you!

Drugs and cognitive behavior therapy no doubt have their place in helping people with what researchers are now calling a disease – that of loneliness. But I know, beyond any doubt that the very best cure for loneliness is dwelling with dear brothers and sisters in the Word and worshiping and sharing fellowship together as a community in Christ. It’s in times of worship that we confess our sins, hear the words of forgiveness, share the bread and wine of holy communion, look each other in the eye and share God’s peace, hear the Word read and proclaimed: “You are precious in my sight, and honored, and I love you!” says God in Isaiah 43:4 - such soothing words to calm the anxious lonely soul. And, as importantly, we sing the words of our faith together, “Come now, O Prince of peace, make us one body, come O Lord Jesus, reconcile your people.” from hymn # 247 in the ELW



May you know a cure for your loneliness among the communion of the saints in worship. May you be welcoming and may you be welcomed. May you always know the depth of God’s love for you!

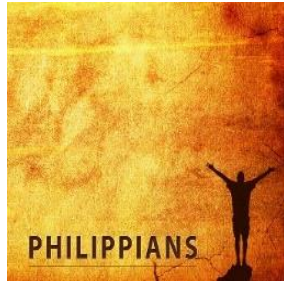

Worship Series**

“Rejoice in the Lord always – even during Lent!” While Paul didn’t say these words exactly, as a modern day Christian, he might very well have. For too long Lent been thought of as a season of self-sacrifice and discipline that intimidates many Christians. Sometimes Lent can feel like an endless list of spiritual chores.



Our midweek Lenten worship series at One in Faith this year centers around Paul’s letter to the Philippian church as a way to find joy during Lent. In Philippians Paul describes spiritual practices that help him sense God’s power and presence even in the midst of persecution and imprisonment. The weekly themes are Joyful Prayer, Joyful Witness, Joyful Humility, Joyful Hospitality and Joyful Giving.

What Is Ash Wednesday?

Each year, Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent and is always 46 days before Easter Sunday. Lent is a 40-day season (not counting Sundays) marked by repentance, fasting, reflection, and ultimately celebration. The 40-day period represents Christ’s time of temptation in the wilderness, where He fasted and where Satan tempted Him. Lent asks believers to set aside a time each year for similar fasting, marking an intentional season of focus on Christ’s life, ministry, sacrifice, and resurrection. Often called the Day of Ashes, Ash Wednesday starts Lent by focusing the Christian’s heart on repentance and prayer, usually through personal and communal confession. This happens during a special Ash Wednesday service.

(2:00 St. John services held in the basement except on Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday and Good Friday when they will be held in the sanctuary.)

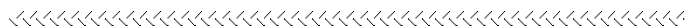

Confirmation & Lent

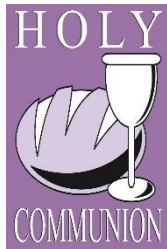

January monthly expenses were \$5,506.35 and monthly income was \$8,210.00. Monthly income included a \$5000.00 grain check. There is \$661.83 in the QSS account. Mission in Christ sent a contribution for this account.

Worship: Dennis said that a list of readers, ushers, and other church duties has been completed and sent to Kris. There is an opening for family ushers for the month of December.

Building and Grounds: Doug said the board on the parsonage porch has been repaired by Adams Construction and two lights were installed. The gutters are working well.

Social Concerns: Joyce spoke of the success of the Meisgeier Benefit and suggested that a donation be made to the Community Center for its use. Joyce made the motion and Cassie seconded it.

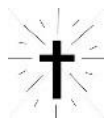
