As one theologian points out, this psalm is very communal: "God is OUR refuge," "God is in the midst of THE CITY," "I am exalted among THE NATIONS, I am exalted in THE EARTH," "the Lord of hosts is WITH US," God makes war to cease "in ALL THE WORLD," "the God of Jacob is OUR stronghold."

While it is important that we know individually that we are God's beloved, these days, let's remember how important it is that we are indeed *a community* that belongs to God. God loves and protects US, God is with US always, God is faithful to ALL the EARTH.

As therefore a beloved community of God's, how shall we live faithfully in response to God's love for us? As the prophet Micah says, "Do Justice, Love Kindness and Walk Humbly with your God." As Jesus says, "Love the Lord your God with all of your heart, soul and mind and love your neighbor as you love yourself." Seek the good and the welfare of all, especially the most vulnerable among us.

In practicality dear people – love your neighbor by wearing your mask when not around folks in your household, keeping 6 feet of distance between yourselves, staying home when you don't feel well, and speaking the truth about this v

Present: Kris Morarend, Jerry Harvey, Fuzz Brown, Bill Hunt, Pastor Margaret, Wayne Yelden, and Nancy Yelden. The council meeting was called to order October 8, 2020 at 7:00 PM and Pastor led devotions from Phillipian's Chapter 4- "Rejoice in the Lord".

The September 10 meeting minutes were reviewed, and Jerry moved to approve, Bill seconded, motion carried.

Pastor reviewed her monthly report and highlighted that St. Sebald will be having Affirmation of Baptism on Reformation Sunday, Oct. 27 for Keaton Klingman and Caitlyn Druecker. Pastor Clark was ordained and installed as our minister on September 13 at a semi-private service due to the pandemic guidelines. We officially welcome him to our parish and congratulate him on this great accomplishment. Discussion on the use of the TV during our services and suggestion was made to have black print on the screen to help in improving the contrast to read the words better. The council members have received positive comments in the implementation of using the screen for services.

The monthly and quarterly financial reports for the treasurer were reviewed. Bill moved to approve the quarterly report, Jerry seconded, approved. Kris presented the St. Sebald Life Fund quarterly report and after review, it was tabled until the council could obtain further clarification.

Kris continues to work with our Sunday School children and is sending them packets of activities to complete in their homes. Each family has also been provided a Children's Bible that can be used for devotions with the children and family.

Fuzz has painted the storage area in the balcony and will monitor for any signs of needed repair.

Nancy has been in communication with the Navajo Mission Preparatory School. They have changed their sponsorship program due to the COVID. We will be receiving a new student this year in the next few weeks and will help to sponsor a partial tuition of \$1,000 for this student.

The Lord's Prayer was shared, and meeting adjourned at 8:30 by Wayne, and seconded by Fuzz, motion carried.

St. John

The regular meeting of the St. John Lutheran Church Council was held Tuesday, October 13, 2020. Present: Marcia Rueber, Dennis Nus, Doug Nus, Penny Handke, Joyce Knickerbocker, Mark Schnell, Cassie Gruman, Pastor Margaret, and Deatra ODell.

President Marcia Rueber called the meeting to order. Pastor Margaret led devotions based upon Ecclesiastes 4:9-10 in which we are encouraged "to hold each other up." The secretary's minutes were reviewed and approved, moved by Joyce, second by Doug. The treasurer's report was reviewed, moved by Joyce, second by Mark. Monthly expenses were \$6,424.24 and monthly income was \$4622.71. The QSS account balance is \$502.10.

Pastor Margaret gave highlights of her report. All churches in the parish are having in-church services using our Covid-19 guidelines. Hope and St. Sebald have large flat screen TVs that are being used to display hymn words, prayers, liturgy, and announcements for our online services.

Because of Covid-19, Christmas services will need to be different. Pastor is forming a committee to do the planning. Weekly devotions (three times per week) led by Pastor Clark and Pastor Margaret have been greatly appreciated and will continue.

The Northeastern Iowa Synod assembly will be held June 11-13, 2021, at Luther College in Decorah at which a new bishop will be elected.

Parish Education: Covid Sunday School has begun for ages 3-6th grade which consists of monthly packets that were mailed to families of our participating students. Included in the packet this month was instruction materials on The Lord's Prayer, family newsletter called *Living Faith at Home*, and children's bulletins that parents can lead their student/students through. Much thanks goes to Bonnie Nus for putting all this together.

Worship: There was much discussion upon suggestions for guideline changes. We will try to just use the handicapped ramp door in front of the church. Members can continue sitting in any pew marked with the wooden cross, however the family markers will not be used. Pastors will reaffirm the exit procedures. November 15th is National Donor Sabbath Sunday. Joyce will provide bulletin inserts and will speak briefly at St. John's about this.

Evangelism: Our mailbox system needs to be updated. Cassie and Penny were asked to try to think of a way to improve and update our existing system.

Building and Grounds: We discussed the selling of the corner lot at the corner of Park Street, but decided that we need to research more so this will not be brought up at our November Annual Meeting. Randy and Joyce paid for the church's bug spraying. Doug swept up pine cones and pine needles. One pine tree by the mailboxes will need to be taken down. Bobby Berry was consulted about our air conditioning situation. We may be able to move an existing air conditioner to another location and replace another for possibly \$1200. Joyce made the

motion that Bobby Berry be contacted so that the work can be completed next spring and Penny seconded.

Social Concerns: The Little Food Pantry is being used steadily. Marcia will place a note in the bulletin indicating items that are needed.

Stewardship: The frozen lasagna fundraiser will take place in December. Orders must be in by Sunday, December 6, with pick up at a date yet to be finalized. An 8x8 pan will cost \$15 and a 9x13 pan will cost \$25. Penny and Gary Handke have volunteered to provide the needed hamburger. Bonnie will make posters and Marcia will provide some assistance. Penny will supply the Thrivent card to help with this fundraiser.

Parish Board: To legally use all the printed materials projected for our online services, we need an additional copyright license. We already have one license for the liturgy and Celebrate inserts. We need another so that we can project the hymn words. This cost would be shared with all the churches in the parish.

Unfinished Business: The November Annual Meeting will be held Sunday, November 8, following our morning worship. Joyce contacted D.B. Acoustics about the possibility of installing a projection screen for our church services. They were coming to discuss this with Marcia, Doug, Denny, and Pastor Margaret on October 14. The PPE Loan was discussed but we know nothing definite at this time. The baptismal bowl is completed by Mike Knox but we await the final touches.

New Business: Directions were given on the running of the sanitizing station. Carter Schnell, Andrew Harkin, and Aimee Petersen will be confirmed October 25 during our regular church service. Because of the Covid-19 guidelines, families are asked to invite limited guests, and there will be no social hour held in their honor.

Our next regular meeting will be held Tuesday, November 10, 2020. Mark moved to adjourn and Doug seconded. The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.





